- *Enhancements that would streamline the tabulation process to produce results in a timely fashion,
- *Incorporate current processes relative to the capabilities of the new voting system purchase by Hennepin County in 2013,
- *Clarify language to ensure the election process is consistent and comparable to the conduct of elections for the state of Minnesota, and
- *Review and compare processes with our sister city St. Paul, who conducted their 1st RCV election in 2011 and determine areas comparable to move towards consistent best practices between the 2 cities as applicable.

*BASIS FOR PROPOSED CHANGES

Three proposed enhancements to address:

- 1. Voter Intent
- 2. Election Night Results
- 3. Write-in Candidates

And

Administrative/Housekeeping Changes

*PROPOSED REVISIONS

*When an overvote, repeat candidate, skipped ranking, or undervote is encountered, the ballot's next highest ranked continuing candidate will be used.

***VOTER INTENT**

"A ballot should not be rejected for a technical error that does not make it impossible to determine the voter's intent"

*Minnesota Statute 204C.22

- *Voter intent application is used if the precinct ballot counter cannot notify voters of errors specific to ranking such a skipped ranking, undervote, overvote, or repeat candidate ranking.
- *The election equipment used in 2009 as well as the new equipment purchased is unable to provide this notice for all these scenarios.
- *Voter intent application is also used in hand count process.

*VOTER INTENT SPECIFIC TO RCV

- *Overvote: The voter selects two different candidates for the same rank choice or column.
- *Repeat Candidate: The voter selects the same candidate in more than one ranking or column
- *Skipped Ranking: The voter does not choose a candidate for a ranking followed by a candidate chosen in a subsequent ranking.
- *Undervote: The voter does not vote or rank a candidate for a particular office.



Allow the use of election night machine totals to determine winners in cases where the winner can be determined from the first ranked choice only.

If a winner is declared, the tabulation is complete.

*ELECTION NIGHT RESULTS

MAXIMUM POSSIBLE THRESHOLD

Based on the number of <u>ballots</u> cast in a race <u>not</u> the number of <u>votes</u> cast.

- *A write-in candidate who wants the write-in votes to be individually recorded for the candidate must file a written request with the chief election official no later than seven days before the general or special election.
- *The tabulation process: write-in total votes as an aggregate

*WRITE-INS RECORDED IN 2009

- *Clarify language such as Section 167.130 Post-Election Review Audits: When a post-election audit is needed and the steps to implement.
- *Standardize language throughout the ordinance such as the tabulation process for single-seat and multiple-seat offices. Specifically, the same application for the final round of tabulation regarding when candidate(s) defeated in the final round must have their votes transferred.
- *Consistent language relative to the City Charter and state statute.
- *Renumber applicable sections.

*ADMINISTRATIVE OR HOUSEKEEPING CHANGES
